

Empowering Lombok: The Transformative Force of Education

Challenges:

In remote areas of Lombok, children face significant obstacles in accessing education and many schools still need safe infrastructure after the 2018 earthquakes. Meanwhile, Indonesia faces a pressing plastic crisis as the world's second-largest contributor to plastic pollution, generating approximately 24,500 tons of plastic waste daily.

Opportunities:

We believe all children should be able to access holistic education programs in safe schools. Every classroom we build removes 1-2 tons of plastic waste from the environment and provides an earthquake-resistant learning environment where children can thrive.

Assumptions:

Our approach is based on a few key assumptions: parents prioritise their children's education, there's a demand for safe, earthquake-resistant schools, the NTB government will continue to support Block School construction, and there's a collective desire to address the plastic crisis.
